#### **Notice of Nondiscrimination Rights and Protections to Beneficiaries**

## Federal Title VI/Nondiscrimination Protections

The Central Massachusetts Metropolitan Planning Organization (CMMPO) hereby states its policy to operate its programs, services and activities in full compliance with federal nondiscrimination laws including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Title VI), the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, and related federal and state statutes and regulations. Title VI prohibits discrimination in federally assisted programs and requires that no person in the United States of America shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, including limited English proficiency, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal assistance.

Related federal nondiscrimination laws administered by the Federal Highway Administration, the Federal Transit Administration, or both prohibit discrimination on the basis of age, sex, and disability. These protected categories are contemplated within the CMMPO's Title VI Programs consistent with federal and state interpretation and administration. Additionally, the CMMPO provides meaningful access to its programs, services, and activities to individuals with limited English proficiency, in compliance with US Department of Transportation policy and guidance on federal Executive Order 13166.

#### State Nondiscrimination Protections

The CMMPO also complies with the Massachusetts Public Accommodation Law, M.G.L. c272 §§ 92a, 98, 98a, prohibiting making any distinction, discrimination, or restriction in admission to or treatment in a place of public accommodation based on race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, disability or ancestry. Likewise, CMMPO complies with the Governor's Executive Order 526, section 4, requiring all programs, activities and services provided, performed, licensed, chartered, funded, regulated, or contracted for by the state shall be conducted without unlawful discrimination based on race, color, age, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, religion, creed, ancestry, national origin, disability, veteran's status (including Vietnam-era veterans), or background.

FFY 2029 TIP Project Candidates PM Scoring Review

Kevin Krasnecky presented a review on the FFY 2029 TIP project candidates performance management scoring. This process is completed each year for the new TIP candidate projects that are not currently programmed. Staff use performance management criteria to score all new projects. The scoring criteria is based on 10 categories, which include: safety, state of good repair, congestion, security, multimodality, sustainability, equity, economic, stormwater management, and travel and tourism. Mr. Krasnecky summarized the scoring to the group. The maximum score is 27 points The total scores for the four TIP candidate projects were:

- 1. Project #613655 Rutland, Route 122 & Pleasantdale Road: 8
- 2. Project #612779 West Brookfield, Route 9 (Phase 3): 15
- 3. Project #613242 Westborough, Route 30 (East Main St): 15
- 4. Project #613648 Worcester, Lake Ave & Bigelow Davis Pkwy: 15

The scoring was also reviewed with the CMMPO Advisory and CMRPC Transportation Committee to get their comments on the results. Both committees provided their priority recommendations as to which of the new projects should get programmed.

There were no comments or questions.

- FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP Workshop
  - Review Consensus of Preferred Option for FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP Highway Project Listing

Kevin Krasnecky presented this item. Mr. Krasnecky reviewed the project options for each year of the FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP. Two options were presented to the members for their consideration to develop the draft FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP.

Based on the two presented options, staff asked the members to decide on a preferred option which staff would use to develop the draft TIP highway project listing for April's CMMPO Meeting. Out of the two options, the staff's preferred option was Option A.

Shelby Marshall asked for an explanation between the "Current Program" and the "Current TFPCC Cost". Mr. Krasnecky said that the TFPCC column contains the current cost of the project, and the Current Program column contains the cost of the project from the 2024-2028 TIP.

Peg Dean asked if there is a separate statewide TIP listing where the Southbridge bridge project will be listed. Sujatha responded that bridges are included in the statewide project listing and what is being presented is only CMMPO target funded projects.

Jared Grigg asked why the East Brookfield Route 9 project was deactivated. Mr. Krasnecky explained that Route 9 will be resurfaced under Districtwide resurfacing contract instead of using TIP funding.

Shelby Marshall asked if projects could use the leftover funds from FFY 2028. Mr. Krasnecky replied yes, depending on how far along the projects are in their design. Ms. Marshall followed up by asking what that process would be. Sujatha Krishnan replied that staff meets with district staff regularly and have TIP Readiness Day to get updates on projects and their status.

Jesse Limanek asked about the Worcester Chandler Street project and if Worcester would have the capacity to complete both phases with Option A, and if Option B would be better. Mr. Krasnecky replied that staff met with the city and District #3, and they were okay if both phases were in the same year. Betsy Goodrich responded by saying that Worcester prefers the entire project in one programming year. Chris Klem asked what the benefit was of doing the Chandler Street project separately instead of one big project. Ann Sullivan replied that it was a big project to undertake as one altogether and it was originally difficult to program the entire project in one year due to the cost.

After much discussion, the majority of members chose the staff's recommended Option A to develop the Draft FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP Highway Project Listing. Option A includes:

#### Agenda Item #5 – MassDOT Beyond Mobility Update

Derek Krevat (MassDOT) presented this agenda item on MassDOT's Beyond Mobility plan. Beyond Mobility is an update to the previous MassDOT Statewide Long Range Transportation Plan (SLRTP). It aims to think beyond traditional transportation planning and center people and transportation outcomes at the heart of the planning framework. The plan is currently out for public comment until May 31, 2024.

Initial development of the plan has included extensive public and internal outreach, data analyses, and analyses of prior plans to define a vision for transportation in 2050, the values MassDOT should maintain in the approach, and the key challenges that characterize the states transportation network. Top responses from public engagement included:

- Car-free connectivity
- Ability to reach destinations more easily
- Bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure

- Transit investment
- Improved bike/ped connections to transit stations
- Wayfinding near transit stations
- More frequent bus and commuter rail service and more passenger rail options

The Beyond Mobility plan emphasizes six priority areas: Safety, Reliability, Supporting Clean Transportation, Destination Connectivity, Resiliency, and Travel Experience. Mr. Krevat briefly reviewed each priority area by providing a highlighted problem and a highlighted action for each priority area.

There were no comments or questions.

#### Agenda Item #6 - MassDOT Capital Investment Plan (CIP) Presentation

Michelle Scott (MassDOT) presented this agenda item on the development process and State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) coordination of the MassDOT Capital Investment Plan (CIP). The CIP is a five-year plan that funds planning, construction, and maintenance of the transportation system. It includes investments in roads and bridges, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, state-funded transit items, state rail networks, public use airports, MassDOT-wide enterprise services, and the Registry of Motor Vehicles. CIP funding sources consist of federal, state, MassDOT, and other sources, The CIP includes highway and transit projects reflected in the STIP and other investments selected through internal MassDOT and external processes.

MassDOT is currently developing the FY 2025 to FY 2029 CIP, focusing its investments on the areas of Safety, Climate Stewardship, Asset Management, and Partnerships with Municipalities. On May 15, 2024, MassDOT will be requesting the Board to release the CIP for public review and comment. On June 18, 2024, MassDOT will be requesting the Board to vote to approve the final CIP. Ms. Scott briefly reviewed spending data for each investment area mentioned above. Ms. Scott also provided a list of proposed highlights for Central Massachusetts from the FY 2025 to FY 2029 CIP.

# Agenda Item #1 – Around the Room Introductions

Chairperson Adam Menard opened the meeting at 3:05 PM. A roll call of CMMPO Advisory members was announced, followed by the rest of the attendees.

#### Agenda Item #2 – Approval of February 28, 2024, meeting minutes

Minutes for February 28, 2024, CMMPO Advisory meeting were considered for approval. Mr. Menard entertains a motion to approve the February 28, 2024, meeting minutes. Mr. Coyne makes a motion to approve. The motion is seconded by Mr. Payant. The vote was unanimous in favor of approval.

# <u>Agenda Item #3 – 2024 – 2028 Transportation Improvement Program</u>

Action Item: Amendment #5 to the 2024-2028 TIP Highway Project Listing 2025-2029
 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Kevin Krasnecky presented this item. Proposed Amendment #5 included two changes to FFY 2024 of the highway list and one change to FFY 2024 of the transit list of the FFY 2024 to FFY 2028 TIP Highway and Transit Lists.

The Highway changes are:

- 1. #612098 Upton/Grafton, Resurfacing and Related Work on Route 140
  - a. Increase cost of project from \$5,000,000 to \$5,817,840. An increase of \$717,840.
- 2. #609528 Grafton, Millbury Street Improvements (SRTS)
  - a. Increase cost of project from \$1,931,230 to \$3,177,661. An increase of \$1,246,431.

The Transit change is:

- Add Project: WRTA011811 Worcester Regional Transit Authority, Buy Replacement Van (7) to FFY 2024
  - a. \$202,068 will be funded by 5307 and \$40,413 will be funded by Toll Development Credits (TDC).

Ms. Clarke asks about the cost increase for the Route 140 resurfacing project and if it was just normal costs. Mr. Krasnecky responds to the increase in items because of comments of 75% review and adjustment of unit prices for materials. Mr. Menard asks for a motion; Mr. McCormack makes the motion. Mr. Payant seconds the motion. The motion passes unanimously.

ACTION ITEM: Seeking recommendation to the CMMPO concerning Draft Options for the 2029
 TIP Highway Target Projects

Kevin Krasnecky presented this item.

Staff developed 2025 – 2029 Highway Listing for TIP two options developed two options for MPO members for draft 2025-2029 TIP. CMMPO decided on an option and the staff is looking for a recommendation going forward.

In 2027, Option A includes the funding of "PRC#612011 - Worcester Chandler Street (Phase II): PM Score 17" while Option B does not. In both options Route 9 resurfacing in East Brookfield and Spencer is put off.

In 2028, it is the reverse of 2027 with Option A no longer including "PRC#612011 - Worcester Chandler Street (Phase II): PM Score 17" and would be programmed under Option B in 2028.

In 2029, both options remained the same. Staff is looking for a recommendation to the MPO. Staff prefer Option A.

Mr. Barber from FHWA ask for pros and cons for Option A and Option B. Mr. Krasnecky replies that the only difference between the two options is that Chandler Street being programmed in one year (Option A, preferred) or being programmed in two years (Option B). Mr. Krasnecky also mentions that the City of Worcester preferred Option A.

Mr. Barber asks about excess funding and if there are any projects that could be listed or if they are for a project overrun. Mr. Krasnecky responds that it is a combination of both. Mr. Barber asks about the Option B splitting and the reasoning, Mr. Krasnecky responds that originally it was not able to be funded in one period, however funding became open. Ms. Krishnan adds that the City of Worcester is working on the design for the complete corridor and would prefer to do the improvements as one project.

Mr. Payant asks if remaining funding is tied to individual years, which Mr. Krasnecky responds to affirmatively. Mr. Klem praises Mr. Krasnecky for the good job in running the TIP and the remaining funds may be used to in the case of cost overruns.

Chairperson Menard asks for a motion to recommend Option A. Mr. Payant makes the motion to suggest option A. Mr. McCormack seconds the motion. The vote was unanimous.

Review of FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 Statewide Highway and Transit Project Listing

Mr. Krasnecky presented this item. A brief review of the projects that are on the draft FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 Transit Project Listing was provided.

Ms. Clarke asks about paratransit and if there will be funding for paratransit. Mr. Coyne responds that paratransit is an operating assistance and covered. Vehicles are usually from grants through MassDOT. Ms. Clarke asks about driver training and Mr. Coyne mentioned that it is also covered in the operating assistance. Mr. Barber asks if the difference in cost will be made up in future years. Mr. Krasnecky responds yes that programs funds are seen for that year. There were no more questions.

# <u>Agenda Item #4 – FFY 2025 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)</u>

Budget and Major Task Listing

Sujatha Krishnan presented this item. Ms. Krishnan provided a brief review of the FFY 2025 UPWP budget and major task listing. The differences between FFY 2024 & FFY 2025 include a decrease in Task 2.3 (Community & Regional Technical Assistance) and the addition of Task 2.5 (Housing, Economic Development and Transportation Planning). Ms. Amoakohene asks if the decrease in assistance will affect how CMRPC will work, Ms. Krishnan does not believe anything will be taken away and it is more of a book-keeping maneuvering. Ms. Krishnan also mentioned the hiring of a staff engineer to assist communities.

Other changes included additional funds to Task 3.7 (LRTP Implementation) and Task 4.2 (funding coming from WRTA). In total, the budget for the FFY 2025 UPWP increased by 5% to \$1,593,595. After reviewing the budget, Ms. Krishnan reviewed the different tasks that staff anticipated to work on during FFY 2025.

Ms. Krishnan highlights some of the work done by staff, noting that community technical assistance and data collection have really expanded over the years into robust programs for the commission.

Ms. Clarke asks about safety, in which Ms. Krishnan responds with work being done for safe streets for all and it will be inline with vision zero. Ms. Clarke asks about working with councils on aging to increase paratransit services. Ms. Krishnan responds that staff works closely with both COAs and the WRTA to help provide services.

There were no further questions.

# Agenda Item #5 – CMRPC Active Transportation Overview

Yahaira Graxirena presented this item. Ms. Graxirena provided a review of the staff's work regarding Active Transportation. Active Transportation includes walking, biking, trails, transit, and micromobility. Staff have completed work with Complete Streets, sidewalk condition data analysis, bicycle rack inventories, regional bicycle & pedestrian plan studies (these will be updated), bicycle compatibility index, bikesharing studies, walk audits, trail work (data mapping, grant support, community engagement, and more), various initiatives like the E-Bike Program, mobility hubs, and placemaking efforts in Worcester.

Ms. Clarke mentions that CMRPC should monitor social media to gather feedback and input. Ms. Clarke also added that trails in Worcester are disconnected and asks about future walk audits. Ms. Paiva and Ms. Amoakohene add that they do not know of any new walk audits. Ms. Graxirena says that staff will continue to promote trails in the region.

# Agenda Item #6 – Staff Updates

• CMMPO Coordinated Human Service Transportation Plan

Tyler Distefano presented this item.

The CMMPO develops the Coordinated Human Service Transportation (HST) Plan every 5 years and the plan guides federal funding relating to Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 "Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and People with Disabilities". The HST Plan should improve regional transportation and address the needs of diverse groups while soliciting input from the community and stakeholders. The HST Plan includes an Available Service Assessment, Transport Needs Assessment, Strategies and Opportunities, and Priorities for Implementation. The timeline for the HST is from 2024 to 2029 and will help in preparation for the FY 2040 LRTP update. Funding sources and community stories were then provided.

Ms. Graxirena announced that the following grants, DER grant for culverts (April 12 deadline), Mass Clean Energy Center for Accelerating Clean Transportation for All (May 31 deadline), and a federal active transportation infrastructure investment program grant (June 17 deadline).

#### Agenda Item #7 – New Business

Ms. Graxirena mentions the City of Worcester Division of Public Health was awarded the Golden Shoe Award from WalkMassachusetts and wanted to acknowledge Ms. Amoakohene's work.
