Agenda Item #4 – Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Potential Action: Approval of Proposed Adjustment #1 to the FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP Highway
 Project Listing

Kevin Krasnecky presented the Proposed Adjustment #1 to the FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP Highway Project Listing. Adjustment #1 included the following changes:

- Cost increase for MicroProject #S12936 Worcester Purchase of New Bicycle in the amount of \$8,750. The new total project cost is now \$43,750.
- Change project description of #613208 Worcester Cleaning & Painting of Bridges on I-190: W-44-124 (1XF,1XG), W-44-126 (1XJ,1XK), W-44-127 (1XL), W-44-132 (1XN,1XP), and W-44-133 (1XQ,1XR) to Worcester Bridge Preservation of 11 Structures on I-190 and Ramps in FFY 2025.
- Change project description of #612608 Worcester Flood Relief on Route 20, Grafton Street (Route 122) Interchange to Flint Pond in FFY 2025 to include the town of Shrewsbury.
- Change project description of #610825 Shrewsbury Rehabilitation & Box Widening on Route 20, from Route 9 to South Street in FFY 2026, 2027, & 2028 to include the town of Northborough.
- Add project #613606 District 1 District 2 District 3 VRU Systemic Safety Project Near Bus Stops in FFY 2025.
 - This project was one of three projects created from a placeholder included on the Statewide Highway Projects List #S12890 "VRU Systemic Safety Near Bus Stops-2025", which was included in the CMMPO FFY 2025-2029 TIP Technical Appendix, and needs to be reflected in the regional TIP.

Potential Action: Release Proposed Amendment #2 to the FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP Highway
 Project Listing for 21-Day Public Review and Comment Period

Kevin Krasnecky presented Proposed Amendment #2 to the FFY 2025 to FFY 2029 TIP Highway Project Listing. Amendment #2 included the following changes:

- In FFY 2025, change description of regional target project #S12938 CMMPO Project Design Funding Program to Worcester – Intersection Improvements at Lake Avenue and Bigelow Davis Parkway (Formerly Hamilton Street) (Design Only, Ref 61364). Also, reduce the funding amount from \$1,000,000 to \$500,000.
- Add project #S13102 Worcester Mill Street Planning & Design Earmark to FFY 2025 in the amount of \$2,500,000 of HPP funding.
- Add project #S13118 Worcester SS4A Action Plan and Worcester Main Street South
 Demonstration Project to FFY 2025 in the amount of \$600,000 of SS4A funding.

• FFY 2026 to FFY 2030 TIP Development Timeline

Kevin Krasnecky discussed the FFY 2026 to FFY 2030 TIP Development Timeline. Mr. Krasnecky noted the Annual TIP Development letter, which included the Development Schedule, was emailed to various town officials, committee members, legislators, and other interested stakeholders. Agenda Item #5 – Economic Impact of Trails in the CMRPC Region Presentation

Kerrie Salwa presented on the Economic Impact of Trails in the CMRPC Region.

Through a formal slide presentation, numerous trails throughout the region were displayed and Ms. Salwa discussed their status, priorities, and benefits. These trails included the Twin Cities Rail Trail; the Trail Network in the North Brookfield Downtown Strategic Plan; French River Walk; Quinebaug River Bikeway; Quinebaug Valley Rail Trail; Blackstone River Greenway; Proposed Blackstone River Walk; Charles River Headway Greenway; Boston-Worcester Air Line Trail (BWALT); and Massachusetts Central Rail Trail (MCRT). A map was displayed that showed all of the trails together, highlighting the regional connections these trails create.

There were no comments or questions following the presentation.

Agenda Item #6 - Federal Certification Update

Joshua Barber (FHWA) and Kirstie Hostetter (FTA) provided a summary of their Federal Certification Review of the CMMPO. Overall, the review found that the planning process fully meets all federal planning requirements and there were no Corrective Actions. However, there were several recommendations that warrant close attention and follow-up. There was a total of nice recommendations within the various topic areas discussed during the federal certification review. Additionally, the CMMPO was also commended on their technical assistance programs aiding municipalities in development of ADA transition plans.

MassTrails Conference – Panel Discussion Debrief

Yahaira Graxirena announced that CMRPC staff were invited to participate in this panel discussion on October 25/26th and spoke with many people about different topics related to trails.

State Housing Plan – Central Mass Feedback

Sujatha Krishnan said that the state is currently in the process of completing the State Housing Plan. At CMRPC's Quarterly meeting, four housing-related questions were discussed, and comments were provided. Based on the comments and the State Housing Plan, CMRPC staff can use them in the creation of the CMRPC regional housing plan.

Ms. Krishnan announced the federal grants for PROTECT and RAISE are currently available. Also, the Mass Trails state grant is now open, with a deadline in mid-February.
